



Not all trash is created equally... Don't Miss the Household Chemical Roundup!

As the brisk temperatures of fall begin, now is the perfect time to straighten up around the house and gather any hazardous products you no longer need. Then, stop by the Household Chemical Roundup to dispose of them on **Saturday, September 29th from 9AM to 3PM.**

Household hazardous wastes (HHW) are products that contain ingredients that are toxic, flammable, corrosive or reactive. Some examples of HHW include pool chemicals, antifreeze, batteries, solvents, pesticides, fluorescent lights, fire extinguishers, propane tanks, oil based paint and tires. These products can be harmful to humans, wildlife and the environment and should never be thrown in the trash, poured down the drain, storm sewers or on the ground. Proper disposal at the Roundup helps prevent accidental poisonings and fire hazards in the home.

It's easy! Just drive up and volunteers will unload your HHW's. Residents are encouraged to register in advance - use this link to [Pre-Register](#). Acceptable items include paint and paint products, automotive fluids and fuels, vehicle and household batteries, solvents, house and garden chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, cleaning supplies, items containing mercury, propane tanks, and vehicle tires off the rim. We **cannot accept** waste from businesses, radioactive waste, smoke detectors, electronic waste of any kind, oil drums, asbestos, sharps/medical waste or explosives.

A **FREE Drop-and-Swap** area is available where citizens can drop off and/or pick-up household cleaners, paint, car wax, antifreeze, fertilizer and other products that are still in their original containers. Reuse of these items promotes environmental stewardship by reducing waste and decreasing the total cost of the Roundup Event. In 2017, 379, 662 pounds of hazardous materials were disposed of and an estimated 3,348 families participated.
