

## FAQs



### *How will I know when work is beginning on my street?*

You will receive a bright green notification on your front door 48-72 hours prior to work beginning on your street. This door hanger will have information about temporary inconveniences, such as parking off of your street and blocked driveway access. "No Parking" signs will also be placed on your street 24 hours ahead of construction. If work is delayed due to weather or other issues, you will receive a new door hanger with updated information.



### *How do I get to my house if I can't park on my street?*

Sidewalks will still be accessible, and contractors will also taxi residents to their homes by golf cart while street access is blocked. A phone number will be provided on the informational door hanger to request this service.



### *How much money is the Town investing in road maintenance this year?*

The Town has about \$11 million budgeted for the 2020 Pavement Maintenance Program. The funding primarily comes from the Transportation Fund, which includes revenue from sales, motor vehicle and building use taxes.



### *What happens if the contractor damages my property while working on my street?*

Please contact Public Works at 720-733-2462 or at [roads@CRgov.com](mailto:roads@CRgov.com) to report any property damage. Public Works will respond to your request within two business days, and corrections will be completed by the contractor within seven business days.



### *Who is in charge of traffic control?*

Contractors provide traffic control during construction, which is closely monitored by Town staff.



### *Where can I provide feedback on the work that is done on my street?*

Near the end of the roadwork season, usually around September, a survey will be sent to your home. Your input helps us continue to improve our program and serve you better.

Each spring, the Town begins a roadway refresh to help extend the life of our streets. This year, annual roadwork is coming to a neighborhood near you as part of the Pavement Maintenance Program. Take a few minutes to learn what you can expect this spring and summer as your streets get a spruce up.



# WHAT'S HAPPENING ON YOUR STREET?

The Pavement Maintenance Program divides the Town into five major regions. The adjacent map shows the central region of Town, which will be addressed by this year's pavement maintenance. Locate your neighborhood streets to see what type of work you can expect.



**Mill and overlay:** This work includes removing the top layer of existing asphalt and then applying a new layer. This work is estimated to take several weeks per street, as work involves multiple steps. Keep an eye out for a bright green informational door hanger 48-72 hours prior to work beginning on your street.



**Slurry seal:** Crews will repair damaged areas of asphalt and then seal the road to keep water out of cracks and improve skid resistance. This work takes about a day per block and could involve a day-long street closure. This may require you to park off of your street. Keep an eye out for a bright green informational door hanger 48-72 hours prior to work beginning. "No Parking" signs will also be placed on your street 24 hours prior to the start of work. As part of this process, there will be loose gravel on the road. Streets will be swept about 15 days after the initial work is complete.




**Crack seal:** Crews will fill cracks in the road with a black sealant to extend the life of the street and keep water out. This work is estimated to take a few days per street. Keep in mind, crack seal tends to look messy, with winding black lines across the street. Harsh lines will fade over time.



**Reconstruction:** This work involves removing all of the existing asphalt and adding a fresh layer. As the most involved of all road maintenance work, this process takes the longest to complete, and time frames vary by location.
