


Your Town Talk

Good to Know

It's tradition to celebrate Independence Day with fireworks, and the Town of Castle Rock can help you celebrate right from your own backyard.

Just like last year, fireworks will blast off from the butte above Red Hawk Ridge Golf Course, starting at sundown (about 9:30 p.m.) on Tuesday, July 4.

This high-flying show will be able to be seen from almost anywhere in Castle Rock. Some of the closer places to see the fireworks include Red Hawk Ridge Golf Course, the Ridgeline Open Space parking lot, Bison Park, Aspen View Academy or Academy Charter School. At Red Hawk Ridge Golf Course, the course will be open normal hours (6 a.m. to dark). However, the Clubhouse Grill will stay open late. If you choose to take in the fireworks here, please do so from the parking lot of the Clubhouse Grill, or the driving range. Also keep in mind, parking at the course is limited. For safety and maintenance reasons, the golf course asks visitors to please stay in the parking lot or driving range area and off the greens. Rattlesnakes and other wildlife at the course may be a concern.

There are no related park or trail closures, so plan your party, and plan to catch this show at sundown.

Fireworks are legal in Castle Rock on July 4 only. If you use your own fireworks, please remember that as a general rule, fireworks that leave the ground, explode, or break off into pieces are not allowed.



PROJECT UPDATE REIMAGINED

Festival Park construction update

Driving through Downtown, the progress is clear. Crews are fighting through the unpredictable weather and are making headway on Festival Park.

In Sellars Gulch, the structural supports for the pedestrian bridge have been completed, and crews are bringing the surrounding ground up to the appropriate elevation. Additionally, boulders are being placed near the shores of the stream and around the bridge abutments. Once the project is completed, these boulders will provide a place to sit and enjoy the ambiance of the park, as well as help protect the shores during storms.

Off of Second and Wilcox streets, the land around the Overlook structure is being repaired with the original rocks that were removed. Plus, a concrete sitting wall has been poured at the corner of Second and Perry streets

A partnership among the Downtown Development Authority, Downtown Merchants Association and the Town, the goal is to transform the park into a modern Downtown center. The countdown has begun, and summer is right around the corner. As we prepare for the official start of landscape season, Castle Rock Water wants customers to remember watering restrictions take effect this month.

Restrictions will be in place June through August. During that time, customers will be required to follow an every-third-day watering schedule. Watering days are assigned based on a customer's address. Additionally, per watering restrictions, customers are only allowed to water before 8 a.m. and after 8 p.m. Watering restrictions help residents to only water during the cooler, more humid times of day.
