## Special election is May 15

Castle Rock voters will be asked this month to vote in a special election. Ballots have been mailed and must be returned by 7 p.m. Tuesday, May 15.

The election is a necessary follow-up to the November 2017 Special Election in which voters approved an at-large Mayor office. While the election changed language in the Town Charter regarding how voters will elect their Mayor in Castle Rock, the citizen-initiated petition that provided for that change did not identify elements such as qualifications for Mayor and a timeline for the transition.

The questions on the May 15 ballot will address those issues.

Ballots can be returned to the drop box in the parking lot of Town Hall at 100 N. Wilcox St, or the drop box in the parking lot of Douglas County Elections, 125 Stephanie Place.

For years, Castle Rock Water has made providing long-term, renewable water a priority. Now, a major milestone has been reached, and the first drops of WISE water are headed to Castle Rock. Join the celebration to help commemorate this momentous occasion.

Many communities in Colorado were faced with a drought back in the early 2000's. Without a plan for a long-term, sustainable water supply, the region was relying solely on underground aquifers, a non-renewable source. Regional water providers saw the opportunity to partner in a solution and share in the expense to buy, transport and treat renewable water – thus the WISE partnership was born. The arrangement is a partnership between Denver Water, Aurora Water and 10 South Metro water providers to import renewable water. Nationwide, this partnership has been heralded for its sharing in resources while still maintaining water provider independence.

Castle Rock Water, the southernmost community of the WISE partners, finished the last piece of infrastructure, a pipeline from Outter Marker Road to Ray Waterman Treatment Plant in late 2017. As a result, imported WISE water began coming to Town in late April.

## Roadwork set to begin along Meadows Parkway

A 30-year-old road is getting a new life. Starting soon after Memorial Day, road crews will begin reconstructing Meadows Parkway between U.S. 85 and Prairie Hawk Drive. Existing concrete will be removed and replaced with asphalt.

Driver patience is appreciated during this work, which is expected to last into August. Here's what you need to know:

- One lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction.
- Alternate routes include N. Meadows Drive, Coachline Road, Prairie Hawk Drive and Red Hawk Drive.
- If you use Meadows Parkway, merge late, then alternate! If you're in the lane that's ending, merge when your lane ends, not before. This will ensure an orderly progression and keep traffic moving. If you're in the through lane, make sure to let in every-other-car. Using both lanes as long as possible will help reduce the congestion.

Water conservation and efficiency tip

It's Sprinkler Spruce Up time! Your sprinkler system is the biggest contributor to your water bill, and routine maintenance helps prevent water and money waste.

Whether you have a professional landscaper or do it yourself, you need to inspect your system at start up and throughout the entire irrigation season. Examine your sprinkler system for clogged, broken or missing sprinkler heads. Check for landscape areas that are soggy or have water pooling, which could indicate a leak. Make sure sprinklers are properly directed to prevent overspray onto driveways, sidewalks and fences. Schedule your irrigation timer for every-third-day and only water before 8 a.m. or after 8 p.m. Adjust your timer as the weather changes.
