



CASTLE ROCK WATER

DROUGHT RESTRICTIONS

Stage 1 – Advisory

Goal: 10% water savings through voluntary use reductions

- 1. Maintain strict adherence to standard irrigation practices that promote efficient water use
 - a. Residential customers follow the watering schedule, only watering before 8 a.m. or after 8 p.m.
 - b. Non-residential customers adhere to the watering schedule, only watering after 10 p.m. and before 6 a.m.
 - c. Water Wiser designations are still in place
- 2. Minimize power washing and spraying on impervious surfaces (driveways and sidewalks)
- 3. Personal vehicles may only be washed using bucket and hand-held hose with shutoff nozzle (or use commercial wash)
- 4. All private and commercial swimming pools and hot tubs should be covered when not in use and maintained to prevent leaks
- 5. It is recommend to adjust room temperatures to reduce use of water-cooled air conditioning
- 6. Bulk water -- conserve and prevent wasting of bulk water
- 7. Construction activities -- conserve and prevent wasting of construction water
- 8. Commercial car washes -- reduce water use by 10 percent where technically feasible
- 9. Car dealerships -- vehicles should be washed using bucket and hand-held hose with shut-off nozzle
- 10. Restaurants -- encouraged to only serve water when requested by customer
- 11. Lodging establishments -- encouraged to promote conservation and limit frequency of linen washings
- 12. Town of Castle Rock
 - a. Standard irrigation practices on Town-owned properties that promote efficient water use
 - b. Washing of Town-owned field vehicles limited to once every two weeks and washing of all other vehicles to once per month
 - c. Ornamental and drinking fountains are turned off from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Violation of these drought restrictions can result in a fine and potentially disconnection of water service.

Stage 2 – Watch

Goal: 25% water savings

- 1. Outdoor watering limited to 2 times per week
 - a. Includes hand watering
 - b. No exemptions for Water Wiser customers
 - c. Watering times remain within 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. for residents and 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. for non-residential customers
- 2. Residents are encouraged to forego the installation of new sod, seeding, and landscaping
- 3. Power washing and spraying on impervious surfaces (driveways and sidewalks) is prohibited
- 4. Personal vehicles may only be washed using bucket and hand-held hose with shut-off nozzle (or use of commercial car wash)
- 5. Residential, non-recirculating outdoor fountains must be turned off; all commercial outdoor and indoor fountains must be turned off

- 6. All private and commercial swimming pools and hot tubs should be covered when not in use and maintained to prevent leaks
- 7. It is recommended to adjust room temperatures to reduce use of water-cooled air conditioning
- 8. Bulk water -- conserve and prevent wasting of bulk water
- 9. Construction activities -- conserve and prevent wasting of construction water
- 10. Commercial car washes -- required to reduce water use by 10 percent where technically feasible
- 11. Car dealerships -- vehicles should be washed using bucket and hand-held hose with shutoff nozzle
- 12. Restaurants -- encouraged to only serve water when requested by customer
- 13. Lodging establishments -- are encouraged to promote conservation and limit frequency of linen washings
- 14. Town of Castle Rock
 - a. Standard irrigation practices on Town-owned properties that promote efficient water use
 - b. Turf irrigation on Town-owned property from September 30 to May 1 is prohibited
 - c. Washing of Town-owned field vehicles is limited to once every two weeks and washing of all other vehicles is limited to once per a month
 - d. Reduce frequency of hydrant washing and flushing
 - e. Ornamental fountains and drinking fountains in Town-owned parks are turned off

Violation of these drought restrictions can result in a fine and potentially disconnection of water service.

Stage 3 – Warning

Goal: 40% water savings

- 1. Outdoor watering limited to 1 time per week
 - a. Included hand watering
 - b. No exemptions for Water Wise customers
 - c. Watering times remain within 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. for residents and 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. for non-residential customers
- 2. Power washing and spraying on impervious surfaces (driveways and sidewalks) is prohibited
- 3. All washing of personal vehicles is prohibited except at commercial car washes
- 4. All indoor and outdoor fountains must be turned off
- 5. The filling of private swimming pools and hot tubs is discouraged; commercial swimming pools and hot tubs should be covered when not in use and maintained to prevent leaks
- 6. It is recommended to adjust room temperatures to reduce use of water-cooled air conditioning
- 7. Indoor Restrictions -- Indoor water use limitations to achieve 20 percent water savings
- 8. Bulk Water Station -- use limited to usage in Douglas County
- 9. Construction activities -- use of all construction water is prohibited unless necessary for air quality and construction reasons which must be negotiated beforehand with Caste Rock Water
- 10. Commercial car washes -- required to implement best management practices and limit water use to 20 gallons per vehicle
- 11. Car dealerships -- all washing of vehicles on car dealership property is prohibited
- 12. Restaurants -- are not to serve water unless customers specifically ask for it
- 13. Lodging establishments -- must place water conservation cards in every room promoting water conservation (e.g. short showers) as well as not changing linens and towels unless a customer specifically requests the service
- 14. Town facility restrictions
 - a. Restrict turf irrigation on Town parks and open spaces. Sports fields, trees and shrubs, and preferred "green areas" specified via community outreach efforts may be irrigated on a predetermined limited basis
 - b. Turf irrigation on Town-owned property from September 30 to May 1 is prohibited
 - c. New sod, seeding, and landscaping is prohibited

- d. Washing of Town-owned vehicles is prohibited
- e. Reduce frequency of hydrant flushing
- f. Use of all water for fire training and of water from the hydrant is prohibited unless essential for public safety
- g. All ornamental fountains and drinking fountains on Town-owned property and Town-owned buildings are to be turned off
- h. Power washing and spraying on impervious surfaces (driveways and sidewalks) is prohibited
- 15. A drought surcharge to support water use restrictions and the targeted water savings will be applied to all customers

Violation of these drought restrictions can result in a fine and potentially disconnection of water service.

Stage 4 – Emergency

Goal: 50% water savings

- 1. All outdoor irrigation is prohibited, unless necessary for emergency response operations
- 2. Power washing and spraying on impervious surfaces (driveways and sidewalks) is prohibited
- 3. All residential and commercial car washing is prohibited, unless necessary for emergency response operations
- 4. All private and commercial outdoor and indoor fountains must be turned off
- 5. The filling of private and commercial swimming pools and hot tubs is prohibited
- 6. It is recommended to adjust room temperatures to reduce use of water-cooled air conditioning
- 7. Indoor restrictions -- Residents are limited to 30 gallons per person per day
- 8. Bulk Water Station -- use limited to usage in Town of Castle Rock town limits
- 9. Construction water -- prohibited unless necessary for air quality and construction reasons; this must be negotiated beforehand with Caste Rock Water
- 10. Restaurants -- not to serve water unless customers specifically ask for it
- 11. Lodging establishments -- must place water conservation cards in every room promoting water conservation (e.g. short showers) as well as not changing linens and towels unless a customer specifically requests the service
- 12. Non-residential customers' indoor water use limited to encourage 30 percent water savings
- 13. Town of Castle Rock
 - a. Restrict turf irrigation on Town parks and open spaces. Sports fields, trees and shrubs, and preferred "green areas" specified via community outreach efforts may be irrigated on a predetermined limited basis
 - b. Turf irrigation on Town-owned property from September 30 to May 1 is prohibited
 - c. New sod, seeding, and landscaping is prohibited
 - d. Washing of Town-owned vehicles is prohibited
 - e. Hydrant washing and flushing is prohibited unless necessary for public safety reasons
 - f. Use of all water for fire training and of water from the hydrant is prohibited unless essential for public safety
 - g. All ornamental fountains, drinking fountains on Town-owned property and Town-owned buildings, are to be turned off
- 14. A drought surcharge to support water use restrictions and the targeted water savings will be applied to all customers

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Stage 5 - Critical/Crisis

Goal: 60%+ water savings

- 1. All outdoor water use and irrigation is prohibited, unless necessary for emergency response operations
- 2. All outdoor and indoor fountains must be turned off
- 3. The filling of all private and commercial swimming pools and hot tubs is prohibited
- 4. Private and commercial indoor water use is heavily restricted to critical uses only (e.g. drinking, cooking, bathing), and may be periodically shutoff as necessary
- 5. All outdoor water use including vehicle washing is prohibited, unless necessary for emergency response operations
- 6. Bulk Water Station -- use restricted to public health and emergency protection only
- 7. Construction -- all non-critical water use, including construction water, is prohibited until further notice
- 8. Restaurant not to serve water unless customers specifically ask for it and there is availability
- 9. Lodging establishments -- must place water restriction cards in every room, warn about possible periodic water shutoffs, and avoid changing linens and towels
- 10. Town of Castle Rock
 - a. Restrict turf irrigation on Town parks and open spaces. Sports fields, trees and shrubs, and preferred "green areas" specified via community outreach efforts may be irrigated on a predetermined limited basis
 - b. Turf irrigation on Town-owned property from September 30 to May 1 is prohibited
 - c. New sod, seeding, and landscaping is prohibited
 - d. Washing of Town-owned vehicles is prohibited, except for emergency response
 - e. Hydrant washing and flushing is prohibited unless necessary for public safety reasons
 - f. Use of all water for fire training and of water from the hydrant is prohibited unless essential for public safety
 - g. All ornamental fountains, drinking fountains on Town-owned property and Town-owned buildings, are to be turned off
- 11. A drought surcharge to support water use restrictions and the targeted water savings will be applied to all customers
