Fast facts about Philip S. Miller Park Trails

Trail length	10.5 miles
Trail rating	Moderate
Trail surface	Native surface, concrete and timber steps
Special comments	Challenge Hill; connects to Ridgeline Open Space

The 8 mile native-surface trail network consists of single-track trails divided into four different, but interconnected, loops with 2.5 miles of paved accessible segments in the active park area near the Miller Activity Complex, the MAC. The trails explore all the valleys, knolls and high points of this 270-acre site. A unique feature on the site is the Challenge Hill, with 200 steps that climb 178 feet in elevation, similar to the Manitou Springs Incline. Bikes are not recommended on Challenge Hill.

This is an active regional park that includes a zip-line course and adventure playground area. Trail users should be aware of all park users and use caution on the trail and in the parking lots.


Parking is available in the park and the main parking lot at the MAC. There are additional trail access points on Plum Creek Parkway and Wolfensberger Road (future). In the near future, the trails will also connect to Ridgeline Open Space and the Stewart Trail network to the west; the Ridgeline Trailhead parking lot is located on Coachline Road.

The trail system is available for adoption through the POST Partners volunteer program. Call 303-814-7456 for details.
